## **Remembering The Fallen**

Capt. Joseph W.R. Felty USN (Ret.) — 'Ship-driver'

Joe Felty was born on Nov. 3, 1942 in Canton, Texas to LT and Margaret (Rowland) Felty. Joe, his brother Larry Felty and sister Margaret



Felty lived in Waxahachie where Joe grew up playing football, eventually becoming an All State center. He graduated from Waxahachie High school in 1961 and attended The New Mexico Military Institute before receiving an appointment to the Naval Academy, where he again played football. He graduated in in 1966.

While serving his country Joe earned his master's degree in communications management. Joe served in the U.S. Navy for 26 years, retiring as a Captain in April of 1992.

When asked what he did in the Navy Capt. Felty would say, "I drove ships."

He was executive officer on AE-24 from 1979-80. Joe married his best friend, Jane Ann Bruns in 1968.

#### Gerson Singer

Gerson H. Singer, 74, of York, PA, passed away March 26, 2015. He was born on April 4, 1940 in Harrisburg, PA to the late Herman & Florence (Miller) Singer. He was a 1958 graduate of John Harris High School. Gerson proudly served his country in the U.S. Navy from 1958-1962. He was stationed on the Pyro's AE commissioning crew. After his service, Gerson worked in his parents clothing store in Steelton before going to work for the Commonwealth of PA.

He retired from the Commonwealth with over 25 years of service.

Gerson was a member of the York Chapter of the Elks Club, The American Legion Post 1001 (Harrisburg) and Post 791 (York) and VFW Post 556 (York). He was a long standing member and former President of the Blue Mountain Lions Club. Gerson also volunteered for 17 years with the Susquehanna Township Rescue Fire Company He was an avid Notre Dame fan. He loved dogs. Gerson is survived by his wife Gloria Singer, his 2 sons Robert Singer (Shari) and Steven Singer (Tammy), his daughter Kara Fillman (Greg), his four grandchildren: Breanne, Sarah, Samantha and Zachary and his great granddaughter Syriah.

Long Beach is a bit on the high end of our price range, not unexpectedly for a seaside location, but with tough negotiations, we can probably make this work.

Albuquerque offers a better deal pricewise, but some, notably Billy Eckstine, whose opinion we all value, is less than enthusiastic about the city as a tourism destination.

If you have a location — preferably in the mountain or pacific time zone, let us know. And if it's your home town you'd like to promote, please check with your favorite hotel or the local tourist board for brochures and an idea of whether the area can compete and desires to compete.

Remember, the main criteria are reasonably priced rooms, permission to bring our own adult beverages into the hospitality room and weekend availability in May (maybe late April in warm climes).
