

After more than six months of glacial, but in the end fruitful negotiations, all the ducks and Duck Rides are in a row for the 2015 USS Pyro Reunion May 13-17, 2015 at the Lodge of the Ozarks in Branson, MO.

Branson and the Lodge of the Ozarks was the site of the 2005 Pyro reunion. This year, the city and the lodge managed to match decade old-prices to deliver room rates and tours that are the lowest we have seen in several years.

The 2015 programs includes 'musts' — a hospitality room with unlimited beverages, adult and not; a fine banquet dinner, a 'water feature;' dancing and a



Remembering Fallen Shipmates and Friends

December 24, 1942 - September 15, 2014

Stanley (Stan) Warren Cox, 71, died September 15, 2014 in Kingsport, Tennessee, surrounded by his family following open heart surgery.

Stan was born December 24, 1942 in Edwardsville, Illinois to Louis R. and Bernadine L. (Hayes) Cox. He was a Roxana

High School graduate and a 1965 graduate of Southern Illinois University with a BS in Sales and Marketing. Stan served four years in the United States Navy, attaining the rank of Lieutenant and served five tours in Vietnam. Then-Ens. Stan Cox came aboard PYRO for the last deployment in 1968 prior to refitting. He was one of the deck officers. After Pyro, he was with the Admiral's staff with several more deployments in Viet Nam and up the Mekong.

Following his discharge from the Navy, he worked in sales and marketing for the flexible packaging business.

Stan is survived by his wife of 49 years, Betty J. (Eardley) Cox of Maryville, Tennessee; a daughter Aimee (Eric) Gibbs of Fredericksburg, Virginia; two granddaughters, Trinity and MacKenzie Gibbs; two brothers, Curtis R. Cox of Marion, Illinois and Robert Cox of Brazil; and a sister, Verna Oakes of Bluffs, Illinois.

PYRO Potpourri

Bad Day at Port Chicago

A shipmate dug up this newspaper story about AE-24's run-in with a sandbar in the early Sixties. To put the incident and its impact (pardon the pun) in perspective, below is Jared Cameron's take on the incident based on sea stories by Quartermasters Rick Tully and Tony Sieverin, who were there.



Capt. Beecher Snipes, who commanded the Pyro when I first came aboard might well be described as a 'crusty sea dog.' Now, the 'auxiliary fleet' comprised of ammunition ships, oilers and such – armed freighters – wasn't generally a card that needed to be punched by officers sailing for naval 'stardom. But as a 'deep draft' command, the Pyro and its ilk were stepping stones to commanding an elite ship, specifically an aircraft carrier. That was where Snipes was heading.

Not! Shortly before I graced the Pyro's decks, the ship was returning to its homeport in Port Chicago, CA, outside San Francisco. As required by law, a civilian pilot was steering the ship. To make a long, sad story short, the pilot, slightly tipsy, it turned out, ran the ship aground. Civilian pilot required by law or not, as captain, Snipes was blamed based on the venerable Naval principal that the commanding officer is responsible for everything good or bad that occurs on or to his/her ship. Carrier command: Scuttled. Hopes for an admiral's star: Sunk. Naval career: Effectively over.
